

End of the Year FL Pan-Handlers ASC, INC. ASCA Agility Awards for 2009 Rules and Regulations

Open to ALL who compete in our ASCA Agility Trials

Here are the requirements: Your dog must compete in at least one of the FL Pan-Handlers ASC, INC. agility trials for 2009. Your dog must either have an ASCA registration or ASCA tracking number. Only ASCA agility trials hosted by FL Pan-Handlers ASC, INC. will count toward the end of year Award. You must send the completed End of Year Agility Awards Form, which can be found on our website <http://www.flpanhandlersasc.com/> either via email or snail mail to Robin McNeill robindogstuff@cox.net, 106 Highland Dr. NW, Fort Walton Beach, FL 32548 **within 45 days of the trial** for them to count. They will then be verified against the reports sent to ASCA for that trial.

There will be first, second, third and fourth awarded for Australian Shepherds and first, second, third and fourth awarded for Honorary Aussie (Other Breeds including Mix-breed) at the end of the year. These awards will **NOT** be broken down by Novice, Open and Elite as you can change levels during the year. The award for 2009 will be awarded at our January 2010 ASCA agility trial. Points will count from the following FLPHASC ASCA agility trials for 2009: January 2009, May 2009 and October 2009.

How the points will add up:

You will earn points for both placement and qualifying. If you earn a 1st place and it is a qualifying run you will receive the points for both the placement and the qualification. Please note that the points are different between a 10 and a 5 point Qualification.

1st Place – 5 points

2nd Place – 4 points

3rd Place – 3 points

4th Place – 2 points

10 point Qualification – 5 points

5 point Qualification – 3 points

The results will be reviewed by the Officers and Board of Directors of the FLPHASC prior to awarding of Prizes.
