NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS

This trial is open to all dogs being at least eighteen (18) months of age, including purebred and non-purebred, except bitches in season, dogs suffering from any deformity, injury or illness that may affect the dog's physical or mental performance, or dogs exhibiting any signs of aggression towards people or other dogs. Dogs are not required to have an ASCA Registration, ASCA LEP, or Tracking number to enter this trial. Handlers do not need to be ASCA members. However, *as of January 1, 2003, ASCA requires registration of all non- ASCA registered dogs* in order to record and track these dogs for ASCA titles. If you wish to continue to have your qualifying scores recorded and receive ASCA titling certificates, you must register your dog and become a service member of ASCA at the time of registration. We will have forms available at the trial, a form is attached to this premium or you can go to the ASCA website www.asca.org. Move-ups will be accepted from Friday to Saturday and Saturday to Sunday.

CLUB RULES FOR THE TRIAL

No entry shall be accepted from a dog or handler disqualified from the ASCA agility program; a dog or handler disqualified from all ASCA programs; or a member not in good standing with ASCA or FLPHASC. **All dogs must be on leash when not competing in the ring or using warm-up equipment. Safety shall always be of foremost consideration in actions and conduct by handlers at all times. Please clean up after yourself and your dog.** No entry will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riot, civil disobedience, fire and act of God, public emergency, and act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee. THE MANAGEMENT will not be responsible for the loss or damage to any dog exhibited, or for the possessions of any exhibitor whether the result was by accident or any other cause. It is distinctly understood that every dog at this event is in the care and custody and control of his owner or handler during the entire time the dog is on the show premises. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the Show Committee may be asked to leave the show site. In such case, no refund of fees paid will be made. There will be no refunds for entries withdrawn after the closing date, or in the event a dog and/or handler are dismissed from competition, regardless of the reason for such dismissal. Refunds will be issued for bitches that come in season, if notification in writing or by email is received before May 18th, 2010.

Participation is a privilege afforded by the Host Club and may be extended or withdrawn by the Host Club's Trial Committee for suitable cause only.

Agility obstacles shall be chosen from those described in the current edition of ASCA Official Rules and Regulations.

Slatless contacts (dog walk, see saw, A-Frame), open tunnels, closed tunnel, winged and wingless jumps, tire jump, weave poles (in Regular and Gamblers) will be used at this event.

Dogs are NOT allowed to wear collars in ASCA Agility. No leads, collars, food, toys, clickers, other aids or devices will be permitted on the course or within 10 feet of the rings at any time. The only exception to this is leading your dog to the start on leash and leaving the ring on leash. Any dog which demonstrates aggression towards any person or any dog, whether inside or outside the ring, must be excused from the agility trial. Any dog which the judge feels is not in enough control to perform all obstacles in a safe manner will be excused from the agility trial. FLPHASC requires that you pick up after your dog at the show site and the hotel. No grooming or bathing of dogs in the hotel room! Do not leave dogs unattended in rooms. Any complaints made by the hotel could result in loss of future trial privileges. No parking in fire lanes. **NO PARKING IN FRONT OF ARENA, LOADING AND UNLOADING ONLY.** *****If your

check is not paid on presentment or is dishonored, you agree to pay a service charge of \$25, or any higher amount allowed by law. We may electronically debit or draft your account for this charge. Also if your check is returned for insufficient or uncollected funds, your check may be electronically re-presented for payment. (CheckTRACK) *****

RULES OF AGILITY ENTRY FOR THIS TRIAL

Entries will be accepted on the basis of those received on each day. Confirmations will be emailed to all entered with information regarding which classes you have entered, check-in times and directions to the trial site. PLEASE if you don't receive your confirmation, call Robin. For day of show entry availability call Robin McNeill 850-259-3639 email robindogstuff@yahoo.com prior to 7 p.m. on Wednesday, May 19th, 2010.

PRIZES / AWARDS

Green Qualifying flats will be awarded to all dogs achieving a qualifying score. Placement ribbons will be awarded to all dogs placing 1st through 4th in each class and jump height. Dogs jumping 24" optionally will be combined with the 20+ class. Friday, Saturday & Sunday, **HIT and HIT-Aussie awards** will be given out for Novice, Open, Elite, Junior and Veteran. **Ribbons/prizes must be picked up during the weekend. Ribbons/prizes WILL NOT be mailed.** HIT is required to have an ASCA registration/tracking number.

If you may finish an ATCH during this trial, please inform Robin McNeill robindogstuff@yahoo.com before the trial.

HIT is calculated by using the two regular runs for that day. A qualifying unfaulted Elite run earns the dog 9 points. A faulted Elite qualifying run earns the dog 4.5 points. A qualifying unfaulted Open run earns the dog 7 points. A faulted Open qualifying run earns the dog 3.5 points. A qualifying unfaulted Novice run earns the dog 5 points. A faulted Novice qualifying run earns the dog 2.5 points. In the event there is a tie for points, the dog with the fastest combined time is the winner.

MEASURING

Only dogs entering the Small and Medium dog classes (i.e. classes in which the dog's height is 18" and under) that do not have permanent NADAC or AKC height cards are required to be measured at time of check-in. **Please send, with your entry, a copy of your NADAC or AKC height card if your dog has one.**

ASCA CLASSES

REGULAR class: The ASCA Regular class will consist of a designated sequence of 14-20 ASCA approved obstacles. Clean runs within the standard course time are awarded 10-point qualifications. Runs that do not accumulate more than five time and course faults qualify. Qualifying runs with no faults receive 10 points; runs with no more than five faults receive 5 points.

JUMPERS class: The ASCA Jumpers class is primarily composed of single jumps, but may also include one double bar jump, the tire jump, one closed tunnel (chute), and/or open tunnels. The course consists of 12-20 obstacles. Speed is of essence in the Jumpers class, and teams must have a clean run with no time faults in order to qualify. Qualifying runs receive 10 points.

GAMBLERS class: The ASCA Gamblers class is the "Old-Style Gamblers" with point accumulation period, immediately followed by a gamble sequence. Qualifying runs receive 10 points.

Accumulation Period. All dogs are allowed 30 seconds in the accumulation period. Each type of obstacle is assigned a point value and teams must accumulate a minimum number of points in the accumulation period (Novice-15 pts, Open 18-pts, Elite-21 pts). During the accumulation period the handler directs the dog over a course determined by the team. The dog may not perform the gamble sequence or any segment of the gamble sequence in order; however they may perform the obstacles individually or in the reverse sequence. Note that if a bar on a gamble obstacle is knocked down during the point accumulation period, the dog cannot receive credit for performing the gamble sequence.

Gamble Sequence: The Gamble sequence is composed of 4 required obstacles and sometimes a 5th optional obstacle. The gamble period begins immediately at the end of the accumulation period. In the gamble period, dogs must perform the 4 obstacles in the designated sequence within the designated time, with handlers remaining behind a "gamble line". Teams will not qualify if the handler crosses the gamble line or if a bar is dropped during the performance of the gamble.

From the ASCA® Agility Rule Book:

3.1.1. Novice Level (Pg 13)

The Novice Level is the first entry level for every class. The Novice level is for any dog which has not yet earned ASCA® certification in a particular class. The purpose of dividing any class level into A/B categories is in the fairness of competition. If the dog and handler are just beginning agility competition, they should compete in the Novice A category. If the dog and handler has previously earned a Regular Agility Standard - Novice (RS-N) certificate, a Gamblers Agility Standard - Novice (GS-N) certificate or a Jumpers Agility - Standard (JS-N) certificate or any of the equivalents from any international style agility association, then they must enter in the Novice B category for that particular class. All ASCA® Agility judges must compete in the B category if offered by the host club.

1.3 Exhibitor/owner certifies that the entered dog is not a hazard to persons, dogs, or property and that the entered dog's rabies vaccination is current in accordance with the requirement of the state in which the dog resides.

1.4 Exhibitor/owner acknowledges all hazards presented by the event and the event premises, including, but not limited to, the condition of the grounds, lighting, security measures or lack thereof, electrical appliances, fittings, show rings, parking areas and the presence of unfamiliar animals, and people; exhibitor/owner assumes the risk of any harm arising for these.

1.5 Exhibitor/owner releases ASCA® (including all officers, directors employees, and members), the FLPHASC, INC., (including all officers, directors, members and organizing committee/s, officers, agents) and BusyDog (including all officers, directors, event organizing committee, employees, and members) and Baker Area Recreation Association and Okaloosa County (including all officers, agents, directors and employees), and will defend them and hold them harmless from all present and future loss, injury, damage, claims, demands and liabilities involving the entered dog, the event or event premises. ASCA SERVICE MEMBERSHIP AND TRACKING NUMBER APPLICATION

⇒ FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ⇐

Do I have to have a tracking number to compete?

No, you do not need a tracking number in order to compete in Agility or Stock.

You will need a tracking number to enter an Obedience trial or Tracking Test.

Your dog does not have to be a purebred to receive a tracking number from ASCA.

Why would I need or want a tracking number for my dog?

If you would like to have your dog's points and titles recorded by ASCA, and if you'd like to receive title certificates in the mail for your accomplishments, you might want to obtain a tracking number.

How much is the total cost for a tracking number?

In order to obtain a tracking number for your dog, you must be at least a "Service" member. The cost for Service Membership is **\$10**.

- Your membership is good for one year; however, it does not need to be maintained in subsequent years, unless you want to obtain another tracking number for another dog after your membership has expired.

This membership fee is **in addition** to the tracking fee of **\$10** per dog. A tracking number is good for the lifetime of the dog. If you only have one dog, the total cost would be **\$20**. For two dogs, the cost would be **\$30**, for three, the cost would be **\$40**, etc.
